
General description of the reform package

- Public administration in Finland will be organised on three-tier level: central government, counties (autonomous regions), local government
- The regional government, health, and social services reform will establish **new counties (18)**.
- The state shall have primary responsibility for financing the counties
- A number of legislative amendments will be required to implement the county government reform. Each ministry have initiated the drafting of legislative amendments in its branch of administration
- The **reform is one of the biggest ever** in the administrative history of Finland
- The current **employment and business services** will be gathered into growth services located from the beginning of 2021 in the counties
- The reform is due to come into force on **1 January 2021**.


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Why is the reform being implemented?
